

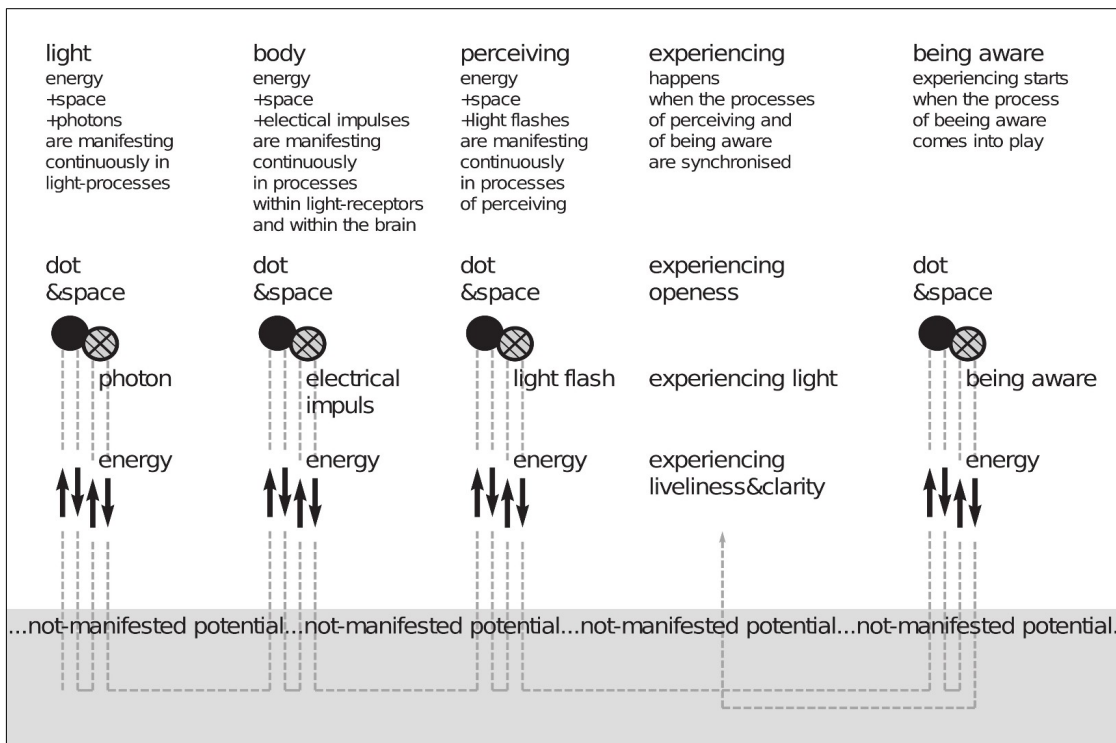
If we want to understand and realize reality as it truly is, we need to question and overcome our materialistic view of the world as solid and lasting, both the outer and the inner aspects of it. The quantum model shows

- that the inanimate and the animate world are both created by lively processes fresh moment by moment.
- that all those processes flash from the same source, from the so called *not-manifested potential*, and immediately dissolve back into it, into pure indestructible being.
- that all processes follow a similar pattern, which can be described in terms of the three kayas¹⁾.
- that the universe is not made out of elementary particles and atoms, which last for a certain time, but is created by the continuity of digital processes²⁾, lively and creative flashing with different frequencies up to hundreds of Billion times per second.
- that things exist, because they don't exist.
- that the world is created fresh moment by moment, but with a memory of the world before.

I think, that my *quantum model* is in accordance with the approach in Buddhism and at the same time with quantum physics. Therefore there is a possibility to bridge physics and religion.

¹⁾ The graphic of the quantum model shows, how the world of matter (light and body) and the experienced world (perceiving, being aware and experiencing) arise and communicate as 3-kaya processes. The common source, the Dharmakaya is depicted symbolically as grey area, the Sambhogakaya as arrows, the Nirmanakaya as grey dots and space as white area, which extends limitless from the black dots. The black dots of space and the grey dots of form share the same place. In this graphic the black dots are depicted a bit to the left. That shows, that space is primary and form follows.



²⁾ In a single atom there are buddhas as numerous as atoms, each residing in the midst of their sons and daughters; Like that, I imagine that the whole dharmadhatu is completely filled with victorious ones. Quote from King of Aspiration Prayers
